City Charter High School COVID-19 Quarantine Guidelines - Families Trimester 2 Updates

STUDENTS WHO ARE A CLOSE CONTACT WITH SOMEONE WHO TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID-19: What happens after exposure depends on your COVID-19 vaccine status.

Vaccinated & Boosted Students

- If you are fully vaccinated and do not have any symptoms of COVID-19 you do not need to quarantine. They are to continue wearing a mask for at least 10 days following the exposure.
- If experiencing COVID-19 symptoms, you should get tested immediately, isolate and notify the school so that the school can conduct any necessary contact tracing.

Vaccinated & Non-Boosted Students/ Unvaccinated Students

- Need to quarantine (stay at home and away from other people) for 10 days from the date of exposure.
- To return to school sooner, students can test on day 5 of the quarantine and return with a negative PCR test* result. *MUST BE A PCR TEST*

Note: Siblings will be assessed for symptoms. If they are symptom free, they will remain in school. They do not need to be quarantined. They will only be sent home if they also are symptomatic.

STUDENTS WHO TEST POSITIVE FOR COVID-19:

If a student tests positive for COVID-19, parent/guardians must:

- Notify Grade-Level principal and/or Dr. Allen by phone or email on the day that they receive the results.
 - Provide results and identify all close contacts. (defined as either being within 6 feet of a COVID-19 case for 15 or more minutes) with the student during the 48 hours before onset of symptoms.
- Remain home until *all* of the following are true:
 - \circ At least 10 days have passed since the onset of symptoms and/or test date AND
 - Fever free without taking anti-fever medications within 24 hours prior to the return to school AND
 - Symptoms are improving or no longer present.

SIBLINGS: Vaccinated siblings, who are not exhibiting symptoms, will be permitted to attend school. Unvaccinated siblings: Please follow the guidelines above for close contacts.

RETURN TO SCHOOL GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS:

When tested and determined to be **<u>COVID-19 negative</u>**, the student will remain home until:

• They have proof of their negative test result unless the staff member exhibits symptoms that are not improving. If a close contact, the staff member must meet close contact guidelines based on their vaccination status.

When symptomatic, but **<u>COVID-19 testing was not completed</u>**, the student will remain home until all of the following are true:

- Remain home until *all* of the following are true:
 - \circ at least 10 days since the onset of symptoms and/or test date AND
 - o 24 hours have passed since ALL symptoms have resolved.
